IN THE FACE OF THE FATHER

The Lord speaks to me at the wildest of times.

Likely because I have four young children and an ambitious, British husband, but who's counting.

This particular encounter with the Lord happened at the movie theater while watching Disney's remake of the Lion

King. I planned, as I typically do, to take my wild family to the theaters not so I could enjoy the movie, but rather, so I could enjoy a nap. I am all about that multi-tasking life and win,

win situations. But this

particular day, the Lord

had other plans for me.

The Lord really started speaking to me during the scene where the father lion took his cub, Simba, to the top of the hill. Both looking out over the land the father begins to explain to the small son how everywhere he can see with his eyes would one day be his land to have authority over and rule. If you have never seen the movie, the storyline is about a father and son relationship and the role the son takes when the father passes away. Do yourself a big favor and curl up on the couch with or without your kids to watch the remake of this cute animated movie! I bet the Lord will speak to you through it, too!

Sadly, the story quickly takes a turn when the father is killed in a stampede. The dark, evil character, named Scar, who actually orchestrated and caused the father's death, whispers a lie to the son. Scar tells Simba it was all his fault and that he should run and hide for the rest of his life. Enter the blanket of shame and

disappointment that causes Simba to leave his rightful position and ordained purpose, and go into hiding.

This is where the story gets good, Simba, the son who has now lost his father, ran to hide in a land where he meets some friends and learns to live the carefree life, singing the famous song,

Hakuna Matata every day (serious road-trip material if you need some). He learns to tame how he was designed to live and feasts on bugs with new peers as he roams the land with those that used to be his prey.

Until one day, the prophetic monkey (you didn't know there was such a thing did you?) calls out to Simba to come to the water and look at his reflection. He says the words to Simba, "What do you see?"

Simba responds confused, "I see nothing."

He looks again and the reflection shifts to his father's face that calls out to him from the reflection in the water, "Simba, I have always been in you, and I have always been with you."

The son, though the lie from the enemy was not reversed, has identity reestablished and gains the courage to rise up and go back to the land he was always designed to rule. He ran toward the enemy to fight and save the people (in this case, the animals) and claim his rightful place in the kingdom, ruling the land always designed for him to have authority over!

If that doesn't make you want to roar, I don't know what will.

James 1:22-25 (TPT) says this, "Don't just listen to the Word of Truth and not respond to it, for that is the essence of self-deception. So always let his Word become like poetry written and fulfilled by your life! If you listen to the Word and don't live out the message you hear, you become like the person who looks in the mirror of the Word to discover the reflection of his face in the beginning. You perceive how God sees you in the mirror of the Word, but then you go out and forget your divine origin."

Notice, in the movie the lie was not corrected, the circumstances of the shameful event hadn't changed. So what changed? The awareness of who he was. He was the son of the king. A king who lived inside of him. There is an enemy of your soul that wants you to forget who you are so that you do not understand your divine origin. The enemy knows If he can get you to come into agreement with the lies that he is whispering in your ear, it will take you out of position, off of assignment and out of the will of God for your life. Hidden under the heavy blanket of shame, doubt, or insecurity.

I pray that this simple story encourages you to reestablish your identity in the face of the Father, through His divine words to you in scripture. Be reminded today that He is with you and He is in you and there is a territory that you have been assigned to rule on this earth. Do not let another day go by that the enemy is prowling on your land. Today is the day to renew your identity and take your rightful position in His kingdom walking in His will for you.

Unlimited Access

hen Jesus came into our messy world, He approached us quietly and unexpectedly. He gently entered our brokenness through an unlikely virgin birth as He came to be "God with us." Still, the significance of this impossible entrance was widely underestimated by most who witnessed His arrival. However, we read in the scriptures how the shepherds came to worship, the wise men traveled to witness, and the disciples became His followers. Each one giving their best response to His profound presence in this world.

And yet, Jesus was constantly pulling His disciples up into more. The miracles He performed, the sermons He preached, and the time He spent were each designed to open their eyes to all that had suddenly become accessible. He used encouragement and rebuke to press them forward. In Luke 8, after the disciples were frightened and Jesus calmed the storm, He questioned them, "Where is your faith?" Later in chapter 22, when this same bunch of guys fell asleep while Jesus was praying, He asked, "Why are you sleeping?" He did not ask these questions because He did not know the answers. He asked so that they might become aware of their answers.

In our present time, we continue to wildly underestimate the access we have because of Jesus. Although many of us are committed to living as worshipers, witnesses, and followers of Christ, our lives still lack the mark of someone who has been with Jesus. We hold back from fully engaging with the unlimited access that is ours because of the perfection of Jesus, who gained it for us. As heirs of Christ, everything that belongs to Him belongs to us. However, sadly, many of us have grown content with partial access. Rather than being at risk of asking for too much, we are at risk of asking God for too little. Is it possible that the underlying questions of Jesus' heart to the disciples were, "Do you not yet know who I am? Do you not understand what is now fully yours?"

In Matthew 27:50-51 it says, "And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up His spirit. And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom." This was no ordinary curtain hanging up in your grandma's house. This curtain separated man from the abiding presence of God on earth. When that curtain tore, it was a literal representation that the barrier between God and man had been removed, and our access to Him had been forever restored.

Every struggle area in our life points to an opportunity where we can access more of God. The following ten questions, scriptures, and action steps offer a template for engaging more with the access that belongs to us as Christ's heirs.

Q: Where are you feeling hopeless?

SCRIPTURE:

"Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God." Psalm 43:5 ESV

ACTION:

Acknowledge where you are experiencing hopelessness by writing it on a note card. Now raise it to the Lord as you quote Psalm 43:5 and declare the praises of God until you experience your hopelessness shrink.

Q: Why are you so weary?

SCRIPTURE:

"Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." Matthew 11:28-30 ESV

ACTION:

Commit to taking a sabbath this week. As you rest from your work, set aside time with Jesus. Write a letter telling Him all the things that are weighing you down. Then, be still and ask him to speak to you. Write whatever word or words come to your mind as you listen.

Q: What has stolen your peace?

SCRIPTURE:

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." John 14:27 ESV

ACTION:

Set aside time to take a walk somewhere peaceful. Bring a marker along, and find a rock to write on as you walk. Take a moment to write down the thing or person that is stealing your peace. Then, as an act of surrender, throw that rock as far as possible. As you finish your walk, find something that reminds you of the peace of God and take it with you.



Q: What fear is trying to overtake you?

SCRIPTURE:

"Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." Isaiah 41:10 ESV

ACTION:

Ask a trusted friend or spiritual leader to meet with you. Confess your fears to them and ask if they will pray with you. As you pray, surrender your efforts to the Lord and receive His strength and His ways of solving the problems you are facing.

Q: What is the most significant battle you are fighting right now?

SCRIPTURE:

"For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore, take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore." Ephesians 6:12-13 ESV

ACTION:

Get ready to get your fight on. Open your Bible to Ephesians 6 and play the song "Fight My Battles." As the music starts, read Ephesians 6:10-20. Stand up and imagine yourself putting on the armor of God. Then, pray boldly against the battles you are facing and declare that victory is yours in Jesus' name.

IN OUR PRESENT TIME, WE CONTINUE TO wildly

underestimate THE ACCESS WE HAVE BECAUSE OF JESUS.

Q: What worry is preoccupying your mind the most today?

SCRIPTURE:

"The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 3:5b-7 ESV

ACTION:

Take the time to write another letter to the Lord. This time, share with Him the worries that are distracting you. Next, write a thank you letter, listing five or more ways that God has shown up in your life, and thank Him for it. Declare that you know He will continue to show up as He has before.



Q: What area of your life does not feel rooted in love?

SCRIPTURE:

"For this reason, I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, that according to the riches of his glory He may grant you to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God." Ephesians 3:14-19 ESV

ACTION:

Play the song "First Love Fire" and spend time abiding in worship. Engage with the song and pray the scripture Ephesians 3:14-19 over yourself and your family.

Q: Where do you feel most insecure, or where do you need God the most?

SCRIPTURE:

"Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to Him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen." Ephesians 3:20-21 ESV

ACTION:

Gather some paper and write down your insecurities or needs on separate pieces of paper. Then, take another piece of paper and write, "God is able." Cover each insecurity or need one by one with the words, "God is able."

Q: What templation is trying to take you down?

SCRIPTURE:

"Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. Be wretched and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom. Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will exalt you." James 4:7-10 ESV

ACTION:

Time to gather that trusted friend or spiritual leader again. Confess where you are feeling tempted. Ask them to pray with you and hold you accountable by checking in once a week.

Q: Are you brokenhearted or filled with sorrow today?

SCRIPTURE:

"The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit." Psalm 32:18

ACTION:

Give yourself the space and time you need to heal. His love is patient and kind. He is not in a hurry. Breathe in and breathe out. God is near. God is here. You have access to His presence. You are His beloved. You are His daughter. You are His heir.





In I Timothy 3:2, Paul lists hospitality as one of the requirements for the early church leaders. However, it is not a spiritual gift, as many assume. In Romans 12:6-8, Paul lists the spiritual gifts of service as prophecy, serving, teaching, exhortation, giving, leadership, and mercy. Hospitality is not a part of that list. However, it does show up in vs 13, when Paul encourages the church to pursue hospitality. It is not reserved just for those who have great people skills or who are gifted in the kitchen. It is something we are all meant to practice. Hospitality is the vehicle to make a place for all of the gifts to operate. When we are obedient to open our homes in hospitality, it gives God freedom to move in that place.

If we look at the word in the original Greek, hospitality comes from the two words, philo-xenos, or brotherly love for strangers. That is at the heart of hospitality. It is not just hosting a group of friends for a meal and a good time. It is not concerned about entertaining or making a good impression. Hospitality opens doors and hearts to strangers and friends alike. It is brokenhearted over the lost, the hurting, and the lonely. I love the example Jesus set for us. So much of His ministry took place in a home, around a table. These intimate moments are where ministry happens.

As I was growing up, my parents also set a wonderful example of hospitality. Ours was the house where everyone wanted to be. There were dinners with neighbors, hotdog roasts with teens, and waffle breakfasts with young moms. Although not every event went smoothly or perfectly, my parents made every event a place for friends and strangers alike to feel welcomed and loved. One example of this was when I was 12 years old. My dad decided, at the drop of a hat, to bring two Japanese businessmen home from work for a homecooked meal. They had been working on a project with my dad for a week already, and had another week to go, away from their home soil and all that was familiar to them. So Dad called Mom to make sure she was on board, and three hours later, I was sitting across the table from Mr. Yakazami and Mr. Hirohiko. (Yes, I can still remember their names after all these years. That's how big of an impression this experience had on little white suburban Heidi!) They spoke very little English, and we certainly didn't speak any Japanese. Mom did her best to provide a meal that they might be comfortable with, without having the slightest idea of what Japanese cuisine was. That dinner was the most awkward evening, filled with smiles and nods and a lot of "hai, hai" (yes, yes). But those two men from the other side of the world left our home feeling valued and cared about, in spite of the meal. And I was left with a core memory that exemplified hospitality at its finest. It is the act of opening doors and hearts to strangers and friends alike.

So how do we host a Belonging Table? Remember, hosting is linked to hospitality. The only way I know how to host well is to think of it as hosting the presence of God. That is my deepest desire in life. To be a host to God Himself. This means orienting every part of my life around Him. It means seeing Him as a person who lives, not just in me, but in my home, as well. It means having conversations with Him and worshiping Him, not just in my quiet time, but all throughout the day. It also means seeing Him in every guest at my table. When I do that, it changes the atmosphere in my home. It creates a place where God is free to move in the hearts and lives of all who walk through my door. It creates a place where both strangers and friends feel welcomed and loved. Hosting the presence of God makes a place where Jesus brings salvation to the lost, healing to the hurting, freedom to the oppressed, and belonging to the lonely. It is the key that unlocks the door to the move of God in our homes and in the lives of all who enter. This is the heart of the Belonging Table.

practical Tips

FOR HOSTING A BELONGING TABLE

Invite the HOLY SPIRIT

Ask the Holy Spirit to lead you as you pray daily for the needs of every single person who will be at your table. I begin doing this weeks in advance. I like to set my table a few days in advance. Once it's set, I walk around it, praying over every chair and every one who will be seated there.

Plan a THEME for your event

This is often set by The Belonging leadership, but you may add to it as you feel led. I like to plan my theme a few weeks in advance so I can pick up décor and paper products as I find them. If there is a special slogan or verse, print it out and frame it for all to see. Your guests feel valued when you are intentional with the details.

PLAN everything in advance

Keep the menu simple, with things you feel confident making. If guests ask to bring a dish, let them! This helps them feel a part of things, rather than just a visitor. Be sure to prep and make as much in advance as possible. Make sure you've lined up all your serving dishes and utensils a few days before. This helps the host to be stress-free on the day of the event, so she can focus on her guests.

Strangers become FRIENDS

When setting the table, it's helpful to use place cards so there are no awkward moments as people find their seats. I like to place guests so they have a "friend" on one side, and a "stranger" on the other. When planning your seating arrangement, keep accessibility in mind. Are there guests who need a little extra space, or easy access to move about? Setting your table can be as simple as paper plates, or as fancy as fine china. I like to keep the centerpiece low-profile so everyone can have eye contact. I try to consider what will make the guests feel comfortable and special, while keeping the day easy and stress-free.



EVERY GUEST is important

Take the time to greet each guest as they arrive. Show them that you are excited to have them. It's so simple, but so important!

Start the event with prayer. Ask the Holy Spirit to cover every part and every person.

Have an ice breaker to help guests feel at ease. I like to use questions that allow guests to open up about themselves as much as they are comfortable with.

At some point, take a group photo. Share the photo with each one through a text so they can all enjoy the memory of the day.



A heart of WORSHIP

When it's time to worship, enter in. If you feel free, your guests will feel free also.

A TEAM effort

Have a team in place ahead of time to help with ministry. Let the Holy Spirit lead you as you pray for one another. If He directs you in words of wisdom or council, ask to pray for the guest privately, unless they give cues that they are comfortable in the group setting. Make sure everyone knows your home is a safe place.



When the event is finished, I like to send guests home with a little gift as a reminder of what God has done. The next day I like to start a group chat to check in on everyone. We often share testimonies or praise reports, as well as further prayer requests. Following up with them builds relationship and helps the work of the Holy Spirit take root.

Belonging Tables are an opportunity for women to gather in homes with other women to find rest for our souls, nourishment for our spirits and strength for our God-given assignments to propel us forward into our uniquely designed purposes as we work together to further His Kingdom.

My husband and I struggled with infertility for just under four years, with two miscarriages. We had seen multiple doctors, had done all the testing, had three unsuccessful IUI transfers and were told our next step was IVF; something we couldn't afford. When I was invited to attend a Belonging Table, I was nervous about opening up and sharing my story, but it turned out to be one of the most amazing and powerful events of my life. I was prayed over by God fearing women who

weren't going to take "no" for an answer. When I left that day, I knew God was going to use this in some way. Little did I know, the following month I would get pregnant with my son. The Belonging worship events and gatherings provide the opportunity to deepen and strengthen our relationship with Him and our sisters in Christ. Each time I have attended an event I arrive with great anticipation as to what the Holy Spirit is going to do next. He has shown up each time.

Let me share about one of the most profound experiences that I had at a Belonging Night of worship at Stonewall Farms. I had experienced an unexpected shift in my workplace two weeks before the event. This change was overwhelming on every level, including spiritually, for me. Up until this point, the work I was doing was thriving and I could see God's hand in all of it. It was so amazing and fulfilling to be a part of His work everyday. Then one day it was over — I was relocated to a different position.

I was wounded, frustrated, angry and sad. How could I be in the center of His will and out of nowhere He allowed it to be taken away? There were many tears. Yet I knew that He was for me and with me in it all. We were created to belong. We were never designed to do life alone. God made us to desire a relationship with Him and with others. When we have Him and other believers in our lives we will thrive.

As I arrived to the event, women were visiting with each other. My dear friend, Deb, and I took a moment to catch up on our lives. She shared exciting news of her retirement and her anticipation of what was next for her. I briefly shared about the changes at work and vaguely told her how I was unsure of what God was doing. Worship began in the upper room and the space was filled with a beautiful release of praise to our King. My soul desired to offer Him all of my praise, yet I felt a barrier. A very real divide between me and His presence. I decided that it was best that I sit down and have a conversation with Him right there.

I felt His peaceful presence come to my right side and I heard him say, "You know that you can't do what I need you to do unless you submit to me." I know. But I am struggling.

I expressed all of my hurt. I sat quietly with Him until I let go of it all. He said, "Deb is going to give you a word." The conversation was so open and clear that it was as if He was whispering in my right ear. I responded

back to Him, "Let me see it!" I got up and began to worship. The barrier between me and my King was gone.

ost people would say I am a carbon copy of my mom, which I welcome because I think she is awesome! I have inherited her faith, her looks, daily word count, and my personal fav, her sass, although she says that is from my grandma. I am also a decent reflection of my dad. I have inherited his freckles, his quirky humor, his out of the box thinking and creativity, his addictive personality and hyper focus. Did you know it is a commonly held idea that when babies are born, they resemble their fathers most? In theory, this motivates fathers to connect with their children because they bear his image. So interesting, isn't it?

My kids have already inherited so much from me and their dad. Fellow Mamas, you see it all, they are little unedited versions of us running around. It's hilarious, fascinating and terrifying all at the same time. The best and worst of us on display. Oof. Yet, inheritance is more than skin deep or quirky personality traits. We have a spiritual inheritance, too.


Numbers 14:18 tells us that God "lays the sins of the parents upon their children; the entire family is affected – even children in the third and fourth generations."

But on the flip side Deuteronomy 7:9 tells us that God "is faithful to keep His promises (we inherit as children of God) for a thousand generations and lavishes his unfailing love on those who love Him and obey his commands."

So spiritually speaking, the results of our broken lives are past on three to four generations and God's promises to the faithful are past on 1,000 generations – got it. The stakes are high and essentially, what is not transformed, is transferred.

In October of 2021, my dad passed away. My parents divorced when I was five and I had not seen him in 11 years. It was a confusing space and our relationship was complicated. I was left with very fractured feelings. The long story is one for another day but the cliff notes version is this:

He was living in another country. The US Embassy identified me as his child, contacted me and thus began a process of cleaning up a giant mess. I inherited a whopping \$200, which I spent cleaning up that mess and shipping his remains back to the U.S. He also left me wondering the same questions I had wrestled with my entire life.



Did he ever value me as his daughter? Why didn't he choose me instead of the life he wanted? Was my position in his heart ever secure?

How's that for an inheritance?

There is a story in Numbers 27 about five daughters. Their father had died and his inheritance was destined to pass them by. They were entitled to nothing. Somehow they found the courage to stand before Moses and ask him for the inheritance that was rightfully theirs. This was unheard of, as women were extremely marginalized. Bold move... I like their style! I also relate to them because they were basically saying, "this is not fair!"

It did not feel fair to have to live a life without my dad. It did not feel fair that I had to pay for his poor choices. It did not feel fair to be called upon to handle his affairs when he never concerned himself with mine. Then, when it was all said and done, it did not feel fair to be left with less than nothing. Not only did I barely have an inheritance, I actually had a deficit and to be honest it was never his traits, things or money I wanted... it was him, and I didn't get that either. Yet there I was with a choice to make, and it did not feel fair to honor him, yet I knew I needed to.

These girls wanted to honor their father, although unlike mine, he earned it. And guess what?! When Moses consulted God about the matter, much to everyone's surprise, God's response was in their

favor! He said, "these daughters are right!" and not only that but He gave the entire nation of Israel a new mandate because of them! In a situation where they had no rights and were going to be left with nothing, their Heavenly Father secured their position as heirs and their inheritance!

From the very beginning, God has been attentive to us. He has been placing value on us. He has been choosing the unlikely and securing our position in His heart and kingdom. He has been offering us everything He is and everything he has.

Galatians 3:26-29 tells us, "For you are all children of God through faith in Christ Jesus... There is no longer Jew or Gentile, slave or free, male and female. For you are all one in Christ Jesus. And now that you belong to Christ, you are the true children of Abraham. You are his heirs, and God's promise to Abraham belongs to you."

He has leveled the playing field.


He values us. (Romans 5:8, John 3:16)

If I'm honest with myself, the disappointments I have collected from my dad have at times become a reflection of how I see and trust my Heavenly Father.

So many of us know the truth, sing the songs, live the life, but sometimes, if we are honest, we are waiting for the other shoe to drop. For our Heavenly Father to disappoint us, leave us, choose someone else. We wonder if He is going to set us aside and if our position in His heart is secure. And if He fails us, we wonder what will we be left with... but God has been securing our position and telling us our worth all throughout scripture and He has seated us next to his Son, Jesus, as co-heirs in His kingdom. Everything He is and has is ours. Wow! We have not been set aside but set apart as daughters but not just any daughters, the daughters of the King of kings.

I love the way Romans 8:14-16 puts it in The Passion translation.

"The mature children of God are those who are moved by the impulses of the Holy Spirit. And you will never feel orphaned, for as he rises up within us, our spirits join him in saying the words of tender affection, "Beloved Father!" "The final question I was asked in that competition was,

"When you look in the mirror, what do you see?"

I answered,

"I see Christ. I see a child of God - a daughter of the King, and an heir to the throne."

As heirs of God, we have access to every aspect of His character and gifts. Understanding our identity is crucial. Through life's ups and downs, God teaches us about Himself and our position in Christ, empowering us to live boldly for His glory. I pray that as I share some of my story, you will see we can embrace the names of God and walk confidently in our inheritance as His daughters and heirs.

hen I was 15 years old, God revealed to me that I had an idol (object of worship) of "vanity" (excessive pride in or admiration of one's own appearance). I prayed earnestly that God would remove this, and anything

else, that was taking His place.

In my junior year of high school, strange welts began to appear all over my body. I was eventually diagnosed with chronic urticaria (hives). Doctor trips resulted in blood tests, allergy tests, food elimination plans, and medication, but nothing worked. Prednisone could control severe symptoms - like my windpipe closing from internal hives. I tried natural remedies and was anointed by the elders of my church. The doctors were stumped and suggested, "You'll probably outgrow them."

After a year and a half of dealing with the hives, I still had not "outgrown" them. In the struggle, I found peace in God's sovereignty (supreme authority), learned lessons on grace and true beauty, and realized the only identity that mattered was that

I was His. I developed such an understanding of "real beauty" that despite having hives, I popped some Prednisone pills and competed for the first time in the Miss ND pageant as a way to earn scholarships.

After two years, I was discouraged and weary. Sitting in my living room, tears streaming down my cheeks, I pleaded with God for relief. Suddenly, a book caught my eye - "The Names of God." I turned to the first name - Elohim, Almighty creator. I read Jesus' response in John 9 to a blind man's suffering. His blindness was not a result of sin, but that "the works of God could be displayed in his life." I wept as the realization struck me: perhaps my hives had a purpose beyond my understanding, to reveal Elohim's sovereignty and goodness - not just to me, but to those watching my journey. As I embraced this perspective, I found not only spiritual and emotional healing but physical healing as the hives vanished as mysteriously as they appeared, leaving behind a profound testimony to God's faithfulness.

About 7-8 months later, having finished my first year at Minot State University, I met my future husband, Sean. Life was good and my faith was strong. However, strange bumps started appearing on my face and eventually spread to cover my entire face. A dermatologist diagnosed them as flat warts. I was horrified! Worse yet, the recommended treatment ended up burning my skin.

I felt angry and resentful towards God, questioning why God was allowing this after I had spent two years struggling with hives! While God could handle my anger, He could not use it. He required a surrendered heart. Over time, through prayer and Scripture, I learned to give way to His plan. After six months, my burn healed without scarring, but the warts remained. I learned some mad make-up skills to conceal the warts and even competed again for Miss ND.

As I continued to struggle with my flat warts, I felt a strong urge during my prayer time to visit my sister's church in Minneapolis and have her pastor, Lowell Lundstrom, pray for me. It seemed like a random and crazy idea - so it had to be God.

Without making an appointment with Lowell, Sean and I obediently set out on the 8-hour drive to Minneapolis. We attempted to schedule an appointment when we arrived, but he had no openings in his calendar. I wasn't too worried... I'd just talk to him at church the next day. However, talking to Pastor

Lowell at his large church turned out to be more challenging than I expected. We waited in line, but he left before we reached



Disappointed about not meeting Pastor Lowell, I angrily prayed, "God, I took a leap of faith... and you didn't deliver." While I stewed in the passenger seat on the way back to North Dakota, God calmed my heart by reminding me that obedience is what matters, and He saw my step of obedience.

As we merged onto the freeway leading back to ND, I noticed a man on his cell phone pacing on the side of the road next to his broken-down car and I couldn't believe my eyes. It was Lowell! Sean made a quick (illegal) u-turn and I hopped out, told him the whole story, and he prayed for me. I got back in the car, pulled down the rear view mirror - and still had flat warts... but I cried knowing I was healed. I marveled that God saw and cared for me enough to orchestrate a miraculous circumstance in response to my obedient step. Not because He had to - but

because He wanted me to know him as El Roy: The God who sees. The next morning, the warts were gone. I had personally experienced Jehovah-Rapha: The God who heals.

With this newfound awareness of God's work in my life, I competed for a third time in the Miss ND pageant and won. The final question I was asked in that competition answered "I see Christ. I see a child of God - a daughter of the King, and an heir to the throne."

Little did I know then, that God would use that year of traveling the state and speaking to prepare me for a have otherwise had.

In 2012, God shattered my world by raising my awareness of the evil of sex trafficking. Unsure of what to do, but knowing I needed to do something, I prayed, asking God how a stay-athome mom, homeschooling three kids could make a difference. God said, "You remember who I am and who you are... and you

Several years later, Sean and I were called to launch Love2Hope, a nonprofit that seeks to educate churches and communities about human trafficking, inspiring change. God's hand has been evident as doors have swung open, and thousands have been educated and mobilized. I have learned so much more about God on this journey as I daily rely on Jehovah-Jireh: Our Provider.

Our work with Love2Hope led us to Willmar where I now lead Parent Life, a ministry of youth for Christ that ministers to pregnant and parenting teen moms.

Human trafficking isn't an easy topic, and ministry work is hard. It's heavy, and the stories are painful and haunting. The world can feel dark, and people are so lost. How do I continue to engage this topic, continue learning and teaching and serving? I remember. I remember that I am a child of God, a daughter of the King, an heir to the throne. My father is the almighty creator, the God who sees, the God who Heals. He is my provider. And all of His power and gifts, all of who He is, is available to you and me. So look into that mirror... and see an heir.
